He received numerous awards during his 40-year career, including a 1965 US Steel Award for Distinguished Service to Higher Education awarded by President Lyndon B. Johnson, the SCUP Founders' (Casey) Award for Distinguished Achievement in Higher Education in 1988 and a special SCUP Lifetime Achievement Award in 2006. He served as editor of SCUP's *Planning for Higher Education* journal.

### SCUP Partners with *The New York Times*

SCUP and *The New York Times* will be working together on a series of webcasts in the months ahead. The first SCUP-*Times* webcast was broadcast on March 1, 2007, and attracted over 4,000 viewing sites. It was designed and underwritten by the *Times* and offered at no cost to participants. It was part of a week-long celebration of entrepreneurship spearheaded by the Kauffman Foundation. The theme of the webcast was "making a difference" in sustainability, and it included presentations on student and administrative involvement at Arizona State University and on sustainable business practices at Ethos Water, a division of Starbucks. Future SCUP-*Times* webcasts in the series will be announced and are likely to follow a more traditional SCUP model.

The institute provides participants with an understanding of the fundamentals of integrated planning and assessment processes with an emphasis on institutional and educational effectiveness components.

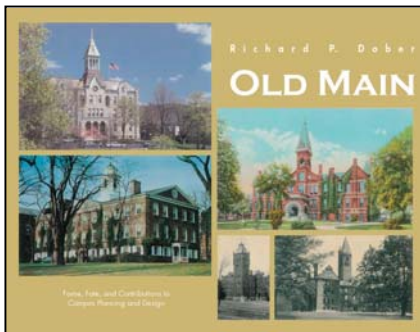
