SCUP Business & Updates

SCUP Election Results

The votes are in for the recently completed board election:

- **Nancy Tierney**, director of facilities planning and management at Stanford University's School of Medicine in Stanford, CA, will serve as SCUP president-elect for 2006–2007 and as SCUP president for 2007–2008.
- **Marcia Harrington**, director of institutional analysis and director of the Center for Institutional Effectiveness at Christopher Newport University in Newport News, VA, will serve a three-year term as Mid-Atlantic regional representative.
- **Niraj Dangoria**, assistant vice president for campus development and operations at California State University-Monterey Bay, will serve a three-year term as Pacific regional representative.
- **Cindy Holt**, a marketing and communications consultant from Atlanta, GA, returns to serve a second two-year term as Southern regional representative.
- **Jaime Garrido**, associate dean for administrative services at Chandler-Gilbert Community College in Chandler, AZ, will serve a three-year term as an at-large director.

These members will begin serving on the board of directors at the end of the joint conference in Honolulu, HI, this July (the joint conference is being held in lieu of SCUP's regular annual international conference, which would have been called SCUP-41).

Bylaws Change Approved: The membership also approved a change to the bylaws, which modifies the process of identifying an annual conference chair.

OLD: Naming the annual conference *chair* by the president-elect.

NEW: Naming the annual conference *vice chair* by a small group consisting of the president, president-elect, and executive director.

This bylaw change means that a volunteer leader now gains a year's worth of training as a vice chair before taking on the responsibility as conference chair, and their two-year commitment to the annual conference means SCUP gains valuable succession planning.

New Initiatives Presented at October Board Meeting

The SCUP Board of Directors met in Ann Arbor, MI (USA), in late March. During the meeting, both board directors and staff members shared updates on initiatives which support members' professional development and resource needs. These initiatives also support goals in the SCUP Strategic Plan, and they represent SCUP's active outreach to members and others who do different types of planning or who are from a specific constituency:

Academic & Strategic Planning:

- Formation of an advisory group.
- Presentations by SCUP members at the conferences of three accrediting bodies (North Central, SACS, and Middle States).
- Publication of the first SCUP Portfolio, called "Assessment and Quality."
- Upcoming publication of a book, "Integrated Planning and Assessment—A Practical Guide," in June.
- Booth at American Council on Education (ACE) annual conference in February 2006.

Budget & Resource Planning:

- Formation of an advisory group.
- Proposed development of planning templates and tools relevant to budget/resource planners.

Community Colleges:

- Formation of an advisory group.
- New at-large board of director's position focused on community college linkages.
- Community college representative added to Professional Development Committee.
- Themed issue of *Planning for Higher Education* journal planned for spring 2007.
- Booth at American Association of Community Colleges (AACC) annual conference in April 2006.

SCUP and CHEMA Look At Future of Higher Education

SCUP is one of approximately 20 higher education associations collaborating on a Council of Higher Education Management Associations’ (CHEMA) research project, which is being conducted in collaboration with the EDUCAUSE Center for Applied Research (ECAR). Through a series of surveys and interviews, CHEMA is studying the perspectives of higher education functional leaders (reflective of the CHEMA membership) on issues facing institutions over the next five years. Results will be shared with the members of participating associations. **Jolene Knapp**, CAE, SCUP’s executive director, serves on the project’s advisory group.

SCUP and NACAS Share Lessons Learned From Hurricane Katrina

SCUP, AASCU, and *The New York Times* Team for Webcast on Higher Education’s Future

New Dues Groups Offered for Community Colleges/System Offices and for Small Corporate Offices

In January, SCUP launched two new dues group. Both of the new dues groups provide privileges for three memberships, plus the option to add on up to three additional memberships, for a rate of \$530 annually. The first new dues group, called "Institutional Group F," serves the needs of professionals at community colleges and system offices, and the second new dues group, called "Non-Institutional/Corporate Group—Small," serves smaller corporate offices, nonprofit associations, government offices, and other "non-institutional" entities. SCUP will continue to offer all other dues groups (A to E), including the six-member group for corporate and non-institutional professionals, which is now to be called "Non-Institutional Group—Large." New "Portfolios" to Ease Search for Information

SCUP is developing a series of "portfolios," which bring together knowledge from different places within the society's collection of resources and assembles them into a single, useful PDF document that can be purchased, downloaded, and then accessed on a personal computer. For example, a portfolio can include articles from SCUP's peer-reviewed journal, *Planning for Higher Education* (PHE); a book chapter, a white paper, or a list of useful internet links. The first portfolio published is on the topic of quality and assessment. The "Assessment & Quality Portfolio" features 13 searchable articles from PHE.
