**MORE THAN 4,000 EXPECTED TO ATTEND
JOINT CONFERENCE ON HIGHER EDUCATION'S FUTURE
HOSTED BY THREE PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS: APPA, NACUBO, SCUP**

March 14, 2006, Alexandria, VA; Ann Arbor, MI, and Washington, DC—More than 4,000 higher education administrators are expected to attend “The Campus of the Future: A Meeting of the Minds,” July 8-11, 2006, at the Honolulu Convention Center in Honolulu, Oahu, Hawaii.

The event is a joint conference hosted by three higher education professional associations—APPA: Serving Educational Facilities Professionals, the National Association of College and University Business Officers (NACUBO), and the Society for College and University Planning (SCUP).

Thousands of senior-level higher education administrators from around the world have already registered to attend. The three associations combined have members in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and 63 countries.

More than 160 concurrent sessions will be offered in the areas of business and finance, campus planning, change management, environmental sustainability, facilities management, future trends, leadership, mind/body and spirit, operational management, strategic thinking and integrated planning, sustainable business models, as well as teaching and learning.

A “Futures Panel” will kick off the program with an overview of key trends and issues driving society and higher education.

On Monday, July 10, Tom Friedman, Pulitzer Prize-winning columnist and best-selling author of *The World is Flat: A Brief History of the Twenty-First Century* will share his insights on the impact of globalization on higher education.

On Tuesday, July 11, Tim Sanders, author of *Love is the Killer App: How to Win Business and Influence Friends* and *The Likeability Factor: How to Boost Your L-Factor and Achieve Your Life's Dreams*, will offer his perspective on how higher education creates today and tomorrow's civic society.

Additionally, attendees can participate in half- and full-day professional development workshops prior to the conference. Tours of Hawaiian college and university campuses will be offered before and after the conference.

The Campus Expo will feature hundreds of exhibitors on a floor plan designed like a college campus.
