**JOINT CONFERENCE ON HIGHER EDUCATION'S FUTURE
HOSTED BY THREE HIGHER EDUCATION PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS
IS AN INDUSTRY FIRST**

September 23, 2005, Ann Arbor, MI, and Washington, DC—What does the future hold for higher education? For the first time in higher education's history, more than 4,000 higher education administrators will gather to contemplate that question and exchange information on future trends in higher education at a joint conference hosted by three higher education professional associations—The Association of Higher Education Facilities Officers (APPA), the National Association of College and University Business Officers (NACUBO), and the Society for College and University Planning (SCUP).

The conference, titled "The Campus of the Future: A Meeting of the Minds," will be held July 8-11, 2006, at the Honolulu Convention Center in Honolulu, Oahu, Hawaii. Online registration and housing reservations are now being taken at www.campusofthefuture.org.

Thousands of senior-level higher education administrators from around the world are expected to attend plus professionals from corporate and government entities that support higher education. The three associations combined have members in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and 63 countries.

Prior to the conference, attendees can participate in workshops. Tours of Hawaiian college and university campuses will be offered before and after the conference.

A "Futures Panel" will kick off the program with an overview of key trends and issues driving society and higher education. More than 150 concurrent sessions will be offered and the Campus Expo will feature nearly 1,000 exhibitors.
