### **ELEVEN HIGHER EDUCATION PROFESSIONALS GRADUATE FROM SOCIETY FOR COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY PLANNING'S PLANNING INSTITUTE**

**February 7, 2005, Ann Arbor, Michigan** – Eleven higher education professionals were the first to attend all three steps of the Society for College and University Planning's (SCUP) Planning Institute and to receive the institute's Certificate of Completion.
