

BU has undertaken initiatives to grow their graduate and research population:


- In 2014, President Harvey Stenger pledged to grow the student population in conjunction with New York's 2020 initiative.
- This expansion includes the creation of new academic programs including Pharmacy, Nutrition and Occupational, Physical and Speech Therapy.
- For every 20 students added to the FTE, a new faculty member must be hired.

- Main Campus is in Vestal.
- Innovative Technologies Complex (ITC) is one block east of the Main Campus.
- University Downtown Center (UDC) is in downtown Binghamton.

- University Health Sciences Campus is in Johnson City.
- Center for Advanced Microelectronics Manufacturing is on the Huron Campus in Endicott.

Smart Energy Building:

- \$70 Million
- 114,000 GSF
- Part of NY 2020
- \$90.7 Million economic impact on the community



University Downtown Center (UDC)

- Located on Washington Street in Downtown Binghamton
- Houses the College of Community and Public Affairs
 - Human Development BS
 - Public Administration MPA
 - Community Research PhD
 - Teaching, learning and educational leadership
 - Social Work MSW
 - Student Affairs Administration MS
- 72,471 GSF
- New construction completed in 2007



UDC Community Impact


- Brings 1,000 people each day into the city center.
- New student and mixed-use development includes:
 - Twin River Commons private developer student housing adjacent to UDC
 - Marine Midland Center converted to luxury student housing and retail
 - City Center Lofts
 - 50 Front Street Apartments
 - UClub Residences

The UDC project brought residences to the downtown area, which required restaurants, convenience stores and support businesses.



Koffman Southern Tier Incubator

- Located on corner of Hawley and Carroll Streets in Binghamton.
- 35,000 GSF.
- New construction completed in 2017.
- Can accommodate up to 12 companies "focusing on research and development in energy, microelectronics and healthcare."
- Currently 90% occupied.



Incubator Community Impact

- Expected to generate \$6 Million annually in economic impact.
- Hundred of jobs anticipated to be created, beginning with the building construction and through growth of the high-tech start ups.
- Downtown Binghamton continues to see development of housing in Center City.

Health Sciences Campus

- Located on Corliss Avenue in Johnson City.
- Current home of the School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences.
- Projects in development:
 - Decker College of Nursing and Health Science at 48 Corliss Avenue
 - School of Pharmacy R&D Building adjacent to 96 Corliss Avenue
 - Ford Family Wellness Center for Seniors associated with the Decker
 College of Nursing and Health Science at 27 Jennison Avenue

Proposed Pharmacy Site




 A location that would both help a struggling geographic area and meet the Campus' space and financial needs.

 Transforming historic buildings and expanding to house Binghamton's pharmacy program.









96 Corliss ~ The Jigger Factory

- Built in 1913.
- A shoe factory in conjunction with Sunrise.
- Used in the winter months to produce summer footwear.
- Together with Sunrise, they produced 22,000 pairs of shoes daily and 52 million pairs of shoes annually.







- Indian River Valley Industries occupied the building and manufactured silt and safety fencing.
- The 3 Butler Buildings were demolished in Winter 2015/16 in preparation for the new Pharmacy Building.
- 375 cubic feet of contaminated and unsuitable soils removed from the site.
- 183 gallons of hazardous waste removed from the site.
- Abatement completed on unforeseen underground steam lines and vault.


































School of Pharmacy R&D Building



48 Corliss ~ Endicott-Johnson Box Factory



Built in 1916.

Called by locals the 'Pioneer Annex'.

6-Story Facility.

First two floors were used to produce shipping cartons.




- The Decker College of Nursing and Health Science project was awarded Winter 2018.
- Demo of the existing structure started early 2019.
- Project includes renovation of 90,000 square feet of warehouse.

The Decker College of Nursing and Health Science



- Includes classrooms, simulated clinical labs, research and office space.
- New facility allows for program expansion into occupational, physical and speech therapy.
- The repurposed building will house 300+ students and 50 faculty members.
- Completion of floors 1-4 anticipated August 2020.

Health Sciences Community Impact

- Anticipated to have an annual economic impact of over \$100 Million!
- Allows nursing program enrollment to increase by 40%.
- Brings over 1,000 people into the community each day.
- In 2018, Johnson City received \$495,000 Economic Development grant for Main Street Revitalization.
- \$50 Million in private investment to date:




 Completed in 1929 and named to suggest a new day coming in the nation.

Shoe manufacturing plant for Jiggers rubber-soled canvastopped footwear.

Employed more than 20,000 by its peak in the 1940's.

In summer, Sunrise workers produced footwear for winter use.

Century Sunrise Apartments

- Regan Develop. of Westchester purchased the broken buildings.
- The \$30M reno included 100+ multi-bedroom apartments.
- Planned storefront for shopping, eateries and a 3,500sf restaurant.

- \$7M for Koffman Southern Tier Incubator
- \$20M for NextFlex Federal Research Center
- \$800K Global Center
- \$925K Freshman Research Immersion
- \$600K NECCES Battery Dry Room
- All projects matched \$4 to \$1 of ESD investment

Binghamton University

- Main economic catalyst for community development projects across the region.
- Estimated economic impact of \$1.5 Billion Statewide.
- 13% of the region's GDP is directly associated with the University.
- 5,000 individuals are employed by the Campus.
- 6,000 additional jobs created as a direct result of community growth.
- Named 2014 "Innovation and Economic Prosperity University" by the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU).
