- Conflicting (e.g., generational, disciplinary) views of the role and purpose(s) of higher education.


## Planning in the Face of Higher Education Paralysis

- > Short-term and/or inward thinking.
- > Fear of change What about me?


## Planning in the Face of Higher Education Paralysis

- Deficit thinking (and deficit reality broken, no longer effective business model).
- > Learned hopelessness, fatalism.
- Failure of Nerve reaching in new directions, moving from planning to action – requires commitment, action, risk.







- Engage in co-creation, co-production, co-design, coevaluation, collaboration, collective intelligence

Define / cultivate priority cultural values for a new social era


